Bus schedules are included in this mailing. Class assignments will be announced the first day of camp. We will attempt to place students in their preferred classes, but in order to maintain balance and restricted number of students per class we can not guarantee class assignments.

## Class Descriptions

### Students Will Participate in Two Visual Arts Classes

**7<sup>th</sup> -12<sup>th</sup>** grade students will attend visual art classes during the morning sessions and participate in performing arts classes in the afternoon

### Drawing/ReliefPrintmaking

Instructor, Eric Johnson

This course will introduce students to basic drawing media, techniques and traditional drawing as well as an introduction to relief printmaking. Accurate observation of still life, nature as well as abstract, nonobjective is emphasized. Students will also use these skills to create a black and white relief print.

### Found Object Sculptures

Instructor, Adam Kemp

If you have ever visited the Stump Lake Park, you are familiar with the large whimsical abstract sculptures on the miniature golf course and surrounding area—buffaloes, houses, cow and calf, etc. This class teaches students how to use their imagination to create using only the found objects before them— a lesson that is useful throughout life. Check out the sun-dog out front of Pekin Auditorium.

### Jewelry Making

Instructor, Krista Bergren

Students will explore several aspects of the jewelry making process in designing and creating unique pieces of jewelry. They will begin by creating their own clay beads and then progress to use these in their designs. They will use various color combinations, textures, shapes rollers, wire wrapping and craning techniques. Pieces will include bracelets, earrings, and pendants. Students will also be experimenting with metal stamping . Sport designs will be available. Don't bypass this class boys as many of the great and prominent designers are men.

### Hubcap art

Instructor, Jennifer Parker

Students will use acrylic paints to create their design on recycled hubcaps. These hubcaps will take on the personality of the individual artist. The students will be involved in the process of reclaiming, preparing the hubcaps prior to the design process.

### Potter/Clay Forms

Instructor, Karla Nelson

Students will be introduced to this art form using different types of clay through various hand building techniques including pinch pots, slab building and coil pots, with an emphasis on useful objects, ie whistles, moving parts, etc. Using these various techniques the students will combine them to make a sculpture of their choosing as their final project.

### Mosaic Art

Instructor, Sue Olson

Learn the art of mosaic during this class. We will be learning to cut glass, creating a design on a base using glass and other objects, and finishing it with grout. At the end of camp you will have a wonderful finished mosaic work of art to take home!

### Performing Arts

Instructors, Summer Arts Safari Staff

Students enrolled in the performing art classes will be studying creative dramatics, movement, and music while rehearsing for their productions. Study will be intermittent with theater games. These workshops will give the students a better idea of all aspects of the theater experience.

- Students in the performing arts will need a pair of tennis shoes, no flip flops!
- We will provide water for the students. Please do not send water containers with them.
- Please send your student in clothes you do not mind being permanently soiled. Many of them will be working with mediums that stain!
