

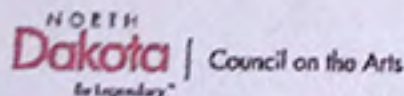

Visual Arts Classes (continued)

City Scapes VS Mountain Views

Instructor: Brenda Baumer

Students will use different brushes and knives to create a unique abstract painting for their final project. They will prepare and plan two final projects (city scape and mountain) and practice different uses of brushes and knives to learn skills to finish the final products.

Dream Catchers and Jewelry

Instructor: Tam Nadeau

Using red willow, students will form their own rings to create dream catchers. They will also create beaded medallion necklaces.

Visual Arts Classes 2025

Relief/Print-making Class

Instructor: Eric A. Johnson

This course introduces students to the basics of traditional print-making processes and to basic drawing and design techniques. The course will focus on relief print-making using linoleum.

Paper Mache Percussion Instruments

Instructor: Lori Nadeau-Condon

Students will make rain-sticks or maracas using paper mache and then their creative skills to shape and paint their chosen instrument(s).

Visual Arts Classes (continued)

Clay/Pottery Forms

Instructor: Tait Simonson

We will once again unleash our creativity with hands-on clay-making skills. Students will use techniques such as hand-building, slab construction, and wheel-throwing to create unique projects. We will also learn decoration techniques such as carving, adding materials, and coloring surfaces.

Environmental Art

Instructor: Adam Kemp

Students will be repairing, reusing, and rebuilding found object sculptures and making fish sculptures. By the end of the week they will have projects that will reflect their individual creative skills.

Performing Arts Classes

Instructors: Staff of Stages - Musical Theater for Kids

Students will participate in a series of group theatrical workshops consisting of dance, singing, and acting. At the end of the week, the students will use these skills to perform "Pinocchio".
