pm. All proceeds from the auction help to fund the Stump Lake Fine Arts Youth Camp. This camp provides professionally led visual art and theater classes in a rural area. The NCAC Fine Arts Youth Camp is a highlight of the summer for many young people.

The camp, which usually takes place in early August, provides experiences to learn and take part in art activities that are otherwise unavailable to many students.

Because of health restrictions, the 2021 Auction was

held live online and was a great success. The 2022 Auction will be held in-person as well as live online. The in-person auction will be held at the NCAC Auditorium in Pekin.

Art for Life by Kirby Berg

Art for Life is a grant-funded program that provides for Art Activities in elder care facilities. Because of the great impact the program is having across North Dakota, we plan to continue working with all three care facilities in Nelson County.

Our first workshop for 2022 started off in McVille at the Nelson County Health System with a Kirby's Glass Workshop. At this workshop residents become glass artists and create their own healing art.

Following are just a few of the stories from our workshop:

- Simon out of the early morning group. He started talking about his farm and his love for horses. His favorite breed the Arabian horse. While Kirby sculpted the glass horse with a steak knife, we learned from Simon that he had 17 horses at one time. Simon was amazed at his first time viewing of glass blowing and the detail magnified on the big TV screen in front of him.
- Shirley visited about her times at the lake with her husband. She spoke of many swans that would wake them up daily, singing songs for them to listen to. So we made a swan, sitting on its won clear pedestal for her.
- Bonnie surprised us with a request of a penguin, which was very fitting for the blizzard conditions outside of our windows. We learned that Bonnie and her husband, Larry, had lived in Antarctica. Larry was an electrician responsible for keeping the generators going, providing the power everyone needed. Bonnie planned to make a quick trip to see Larry in the the Arctic, but ended up staying for five months. She had to wait for the next airplane to come back! She kept busy helping deliver food and supplies to local camps surrounded by many penguins.
- Our navy hero vet, Joe, was excited to create a flying eagle pendant that he wanted to wear around his neck.
- NCAC's founder, Brenda Bjorlie created a llama. Llamas are her favorite animals to collect. She experienced glass blowing with a torch for the first time, in the very program she helped to bring to Nelson County care facilities.

Later in the afternoon, residents visited and planned their works of art. We created a blue cross, yellow lab, a purple tear drop pendant, a couple of heart pendants for Valentine's Day. Throughout the workshop, we witnessed the positive healing benefits that come from creating. The stories connected to the artwork are awesome.

2021 Fine Arts Youth Camp

The 2021 Stump Lake Fine Arts Youth Camp took place August 2nd-7th, hosted by our new camp directors Kirby & Shelli Berg. During the camp, the youth enjoyed scavaging the shores of Stump Lake for materials and inspiration for creative artistic projects. With the summer Olympics in the headlines, the kids decided to make a weight lifter like they had seen on TV the night before. Together they created a scene, made from driftwood, of the Olympics. Included in the scene was a super fan, cheering on the Olympian with the "cool guy" emoji face. They also made abstract painted sculputures out of more drift wood for the "Found Scultpure" class. This year, Kirby substituted for Adam Kemp, the legendary leader of the Found Sculpture Class. The Drawing Classes, instructed by Kirby, were held indoors and outdoors this year. Kids learned how to draw quick thumbnail sketches from Stump Lake nature scenes. Brenda Baumer's Acrylic Painting Classes focused on landscapes, with emphasis on objects becoming center points. She showed the students how to blend colors to create sunsets, sunrises and other skylines with mountains, lakes, and prairie grasses as landcape features.

Karla Nelson taught the ceramics classes, which had the children sculpting their very own garden totems out of clay. The kids painted glazes to color their art. Karla fired the pottery in kilns at Muddy Waters Clay Center in Grand Forks. The finished garden totems were then delivered to the students after camp. Summer Arts Safari from Grand Forks spent the week preparing the Performing Arts students with the skills needed for their "Frozen" kids' performance for our big show on Saturday. The production and childrens art show was a great success with many attending, filling the Old Settlers Pavillion.







The new Stump Lake Cafe served lunch and snacks daily keeping our artists, instructors, and volunteers well fed, giving them energy to create the amazing art all week. Thank you volunteers, artists who donated their work, art supporters who purchased the art work at our Winter Art Auction. A special "thank you" to those who provide direct scholarship funding & donations that ensure no child is ever turned away from the Stump Lake Fine Arts Youth Camp over money concerns. Planning has already begun for this year's camp!
